- 1. <u>WARREN</u> On the inboard side of the wheel spider there is a V or U notch on one of the spider legs which is on Warren wheels <u>only</u>.
- 2. NORRIS THERMADORE A "N.T." is placed on the spider face 180° opposed to the

GM65 stamp. In addition to this Norris Thermadore is the only source which incorporates a flange on the wind clearance slots of the Passenger and Chevelle wheels.
3. <u>KELSEY HAYES</u> - The only identification is the trademark stamp in the drop center area of
the tire side of rim.
